- How can we mitigate water-related threats to economic prosperity, human health and political stability, and reduce our vulnerability to water-related disasters? What governance failures do we need to address?
- At the same time, how can we harness the potential of water to foster development and economic growth?
- How can we ensure that water remains a catalyst for cooperation? What role can the United Nations water conventions play in enabling more effective transboundary cooperation?
- How can the post-2015 framework and universal SDGs respond to water-related risks in order to ensure a sustainable future?
- What partnerships will be needed?

Interventions should last not more than 2 minutes. Participants in the discussion are invited to share good practices and key factors of success to prevent and reduce water-related risks and ensure sustainable development.
