#### **ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE**

Swiss citizens travelling to Azerbaijan need a visa. Visit the website of the <u>Embassy of the Republic of Azerbaijan in Bern</u> for visa information. For short-term visa (single entry up to 30 days), Electronic visas (<u>E-Visas</u>) are available through the "ASAN Visa" system. <u>Attention</u>: during the COVID-19 pandemic, special rules apply – see <u>Cabinet of Ministers of the Republic of Azerbaijan</u>'s website.

Following arrival in Azerbaijan, the traveller must register with the State Migration Service within 15 calendar days. Visit the website of <u>the State Migration Service</u> for registration information.

Transfer from the Heydar Aliyev International Airport to the Baku city center: there are shuttles, as well as taxis.

#### **HEALTH REQUIREMENTS**

Please refer to the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs (FDFA) Travel Advice for Azerbaijan.

Regarding COVID-19, PCR and/or antigen tests are widely available. Individuals bear the costs of the tests. For more information, see Cabinet of Ministers of the Republic of Azerbaijan's website.

## PUBLIC SECURITY / RECOMMENDED PRECAUTIONS

#### **TIME ZONE**

Time zone in Azerbaijan is GMT+4.

Azerbaijan does not apply daylight saving time. Azerbaijan is two or three hours ahead of Switzerland, depending on the season.

#### **BUSINESS HOURS**

Business hours are usually 09.00-18.00 and 40 hours per week with 8 hours per day. Banks are closed during the weekend, but most shops are open.

In addition, days to celebrate holidays like Novruz (5 days), Eid al-Adha (2 days) and Eid al-Fitr (2 days) are determined and made public by the authorities until the end of every December.<sup>1</sup>

#### **COMMUNICATION: TELEPHONE AND INTERNET**

Azerbaijan's country code is +994

Local SIM cards are widely available at shops all over the country.

#### **ELECTRICITY SUPPLY**

Electricity plug and socket: plug types C and F are used. Azerbaijan operates on a 220V supply voltage and 50Hz.





#### **METHODS OF PAYMENT**

National currency in Azerbaijan is the Manat (AZN).

Exchange rate as of June 2022: 1 CHF = approx.1,74 AZN.

When entering or leaving the country with AZN 10'000 or more in cash or other monetary instruments, the money must be declared in writing to the customs office.

In many areas of the economy, retail transactions are still often completed on a cash basis. However, ATMs and credit/debit card payment machines are increasingly available in the retail market. Foreign credit cards are not yet universally accepted. Large transactions are accomplished through inter-bank wire transfers. All payments in Azerbaijan must be made in the local currency, the Azerbaijani manat.

#### **LOCAL TRANSPORT**

The most commonly used kind of public transport is subway (in Baku) and bus.

Taxi fare for a 15 minutes journey: between 4-8 CHF

Main ride hailing apps: Uber, Bolt, Taxi 189

Main method of payment for taxi and subways: For taxi: digital payment via app or cash. For subway: BakuCards are sold in kiosks and entrances to the subway.

Car rental with/without a driver can be arranged at numerous companies, for example: Sixt, Hertz, Europear.

#### **ACCOMMODATION, TEMPORARY OFFICE SPACE**

Many hotels of different categories are available in Baku.

Office space can be rented for short periods. There are also some co-working spaces.

#### LANGUAGES USED FOR BUSINESS

Azerbaijani is the official language and therefore, trade language is Azerbaijani.

In addition, English and/or Russian are often used by trade partners.
