



Building on Art. The 1st exhibition of Le Corbusier's art in Singapore

23 November – 20 December 2019

As an architect, he was a pioneer of of prints, and many tapestries, Modernism. As an urbanist and author, he was a guarantee for sensation. As a designer, he is most famously known for his timeless arm-chairs. Le Corbusier, born in La Chaux-de-Fonds in Switzerland as Charles-Edouard Jeanneret-Gris in 1887, was a berserk of creative power. The strength and inspiration for this tour the force came from his own artwork. It is 'the key to my architecture', he repeatedly emphasised. 500 oil paintings, thousands of drawings and collages, hundreds of sculptures, and enamel works bear testimony to the importance of his art creation. In these, he developed his formal arsenal, searched for balance of proportion, which he then used as an architect.

For the first time, a selection of Le Corbusier's art is currently shown to the public in Singapore. Curated by PLACART Zurich and G8A Architects, the exhibition is open to visitors from 23 November – 20 December 2019.

Tomorrow Is An Island, as inland, a sinland, is an artist-led project that brings together four artists and two writers from Singapore and Switzerland to rethink ideas of systemic change, counter-map traditional ideas of boundaries and envision new forms of assemblage.

As a collateral event of the Singapore Biennale 2019, the exhibition features co-curators Monica Ursina Jäger and Jason Wee, artists Nicole Bachmann and Weixin Quek Chong, and writers Damian Christinger and Marcus Yee. Amongst others, visitors can admire visual arts, such as text-based work and a 3-channel video installation on 'Forest Tales and Emerald Fictions', as well as a durational performance emphasising inter-body relationships.

Open Call for ThinkSwiss Research Scholarships 2020

Switzerland is a hub for excellent education, science, technology and innovation. It has outstanding universities with **numerous programs and highly-ranked public research institutions**. ThinkSwiss scholarships offer students from Singapore the opportunity to spend three months as a research intern in Switzerland.

The scholarship is open to students currently enrolled with a Singaporean university who have completed 2nd year of graduation or postgraduation. Students are responsible for finding a host professor or mentor at a Swiss institutions as well as clarifying the scope of a research project before submitting the scholarship application. Upon success, students are supported with a prorated amount of CHF 1600 (approx. SGD 2200) per month for a period of up to three months between 1 May and 1 December 2020.




