Death in Thailand: entry in the Swiss civil status register

September 2022

Documents to submit

- □ **Original of the death certificate** (*Thor.Ror. 5, Part 1*) or **extract of death register** (*Thor.Ror. 4/Gor*) including legalization by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Thailand
 - The death certificate will be issued by the responsible Amphoe (district office) or a Tesaban (municipality office).
- □ **Translation of the death certificate** to English or a Swiss national language
- □ Swiss passport and/or Swiss Identity card of the deceased (document will be returned to the relatives after cancellation)

All original certificates and documents can be handed in during <u>opening hours</u> (with prior <u>appointment</u>) and by post.

Translation

Documents in Thai must be translated into German, French, Italian or English. A list of possible translation agencies can be found on the following website: https://www.eda.admin.ch/countries/thailand/en/home/services/translations.html

Legalisation

An authorized person has to bring the original death certificate or the extract of death register to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs for the legalization. The authorized person will need to prove the relationship to the deceased (e.g. marriage certificate or confirmation issued by the Embassy). If a third person or an organization will obtain the legalization, an authorization letter issued by the Embassy or the relatives of the deceased will also be required.

Certificate of body release

The local authorities usually need a «certificate of body release» from the Embassy to retrieve the body from the hospital. In order to issue this document a confirmation of the bereaved has to be sent to the embassy indicating to whom the body can be released. This document has to be signed and sent together with a photocopy of the passports or identity card by email. If a funeral home has been assigned, they will take care of this certificate

Fortune / Inheritance in Thailand

There is no public authority in Thailand in charge of managing the assets of a deceased person. The legal heirs or the concerned parties have to ask the Court to appoint an administrator for the inheritance, usually a lawyer, to arrange the assets and all necessary formalities concerned. The duty of the administrator is to allot the assets in accordance with the article 1629 of the Civil and Commercial Code (CCC). Per local customs, there is no need to appoint any administrator, if no assets of the deceased are available in Thailand. Moreover, it would be impossible to define a competent court.

If no heir is living in the host country (i. e. Thailand), it would be recommended to manage the assets according to the law of the deceased's country of origin, in conformity with the article 87 of the "Federal act on international private law (Legge federale sul diritto internazionale private, LDIP)". In this case, the competent jurisdiction is the court of the place of origin of the deceased.

Widow's pension

If the deceased was registered at the Embassy, the Federal Old-Age and Survivors' Insurance OASI will be informed directly of its death. On the following link Form 318.000.2 the spouse can apply for a Survivors pension. Once the document filled out and signed, it can be sent to our Embassy for transmission to the OASI.
