<p>Further documents</p> <p>If the marriage has been concluded with a citizen of a third country, the Regional Consular Center in Bangkok can require further documents related to the marriage (extract from marriage register, birth certificate etc.). <p>Fees</p> <p>The visa application is free of charge for spouses of Swiss and EU/EFTA citizens. Here you can find information regarding visa fees.</p>	
<p>Procedure</p> <p>The procedure for family reunion may take 8 to 12 weeks and depends on the registration of the marriage by the civil registry office in Switzerland. The visa application will be submitted to the cantonal migration office competent for the Swiss spouse's place of residence. Information regarding the processing time can be given by the authorities in Switzerland only. In general, the Swiss spouse is informed by the cantonal migration office once the authorization to enter Switzerland has been granted (form „Ermächtigung zur Visumerteilung“ or “Autorisation habilitant les représentations Suisses à délivrer un visa”).</p>	
<p>Collection of Visa</p> <p>The Visa D is delivered by the Swiss Regional Consular Center in Bangkok.</p> <p>Please book an appointment in advance and bring the following documents during opening hours (by the applicant or a third person):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">original passportcopy of the "authorization to Enter Switzerland" <p>If possible, the visa will be issued immediately.</p>
