Marriage Equality in Switzerland

July 1, 2022, was an important day for equality in Switzerland as a new law legalizing samesex marriage entered into force. Swiss voters backed the move in a nationwide referendum on September 26, 2021—in an example of Switzerland's practice of direct democracy. Same-sex couples can now marry or convert registered partnerships into marriages. The move follows years of advocacy, debate, and discussion in the country of 8.6 million.

<u>Zitronekuchen</u> (Adapted from Betty Bossi) Getränkter Zitronenkuchen is a

much beloved and classic citrusy dessert in most Swiss kitchens and

can be found at almost any summertime party. With the Swiss National Day celebrations approaching on August 1st, baking this Swiss lemon cake is the perfect opportunity to have a taste of Switzerland on the occasion. You will need: Butter, softened 1 cup



1 1/4 cups Sugar 1 pinch Salt

Eggs

Lemons 5 2 cups Flour Baking powder 1 tsp 3/4 cup Powdered sugar **Directions:** 1. Preheat oven to 350 °F.

- 2. In a mixing bowl, stir sugar and salt into the butter. Stir in one egg at a time, continuing to stir until the mixture is lighter in color. Grate the zest from three lemons and stir into the mixture as well.
- 3. In a separate bowl mix flour and baking powder, and add to the existing mixture. Pour the dough into a greased loaf pan. 4. Bake for about 1 hour in the lower half of the oven. Remove cake, allow to cool slightly, and pierce the top with a wooden skewer.
- 5. To make the glaze, squeeze two lemons, stir in the powdered sugar, and pour over cake.
- Enjoy!

6. Remove the cake from the pan and allow to cool on a rack.









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
