


## **ROMANSH**

Romansh is the main language of 0.5 % of the Swiss population, which amounts to around 60'000 people.



5 regional varieties

have evolved over time; they are referred to as "idioms" instead of dialects because they have a standardised written form

the idioms are called:

Sursilvan, Sutsilvan, Surmiran, Puter and Vallader
