Switzerland at the Paris 2024 Olympics

July 26 - August 11, 2024

The 2024 Summer Olympic Games are just around the corner, with 10,500 athletes from around the globe heading to Paris to showcase their extraordinary skills. Among them are 128 Swiss athletes competing in a range of disciplines. You can get to know the entire Swiss Olympic team here. Though Switzerland might be associated more with winter sports, to date the country has won a total of 205 medals at the Summer Olympics, with its best showing in Tokyo in 2021 with 13 medals. But Switzerland's ties to the Olympics run even deeper: did you know that, since 1915, the headquarters of the International Olympic Committee has been in the Swiss city of Lausanne? In the U.S., you can watch live coverage on NBC Olympics. And stay tuned for the 2024 Paralympics, which will take place from August 28 to September 8, 2024.


Swiss Club DC: Swiss National Day

Winterthur Museum, Garden & Library 5105 Kennett Pike Winterthur, DE 19807

Don't have any plans yet for the summer? Don't worry, we've got you covered. Throughout the summer, we'll be offering a twist on our traditional Swiss Rendez-Vous by featuring Swiss destinations that are easy road trips from Washington, DC. Next up is the Winterthur Museum, Garden & Library in Delaware. Just under three hours, or 116 miles, by car from DC, you will find this beautiful country estate that belonged to Swiss-French businessman Jacques Antoine Bidermann and his wife Evelina du Pont of the wealthy du Pont family. They moved into their manor house in 1839 and named it after Bidermann's home in Switzerland: Winterthur in the Canton of Zurich. In Winterthur, DE, you can tour the Du Pont Mansion and explore its gardens. Be sure you have plenty of time for your visit: the museum has over 90,000 decorative arts objects to admire and the gardens extend over more than 60 acres! General admission is \$25 for adults, with discounts for children, students, and seniors. You can find more information on this charming Swiss Rendez-Vous on their website.
