# AMBASSADOR'S FOREWORD



The last two years have been disruptive in many ways. The Covid-19 pandemic followed by increasing geopolitical instability have called into question much of what we took for granted and confronted our societies and economies with unprecedented challenges. As the global economy navigates these headwinds, Swiss-U.S. ties have shown resilience, and have even been further strengthened over recent years.

Trade between the two countries has increased substantially, with the United States emerging as Switzerland's number one export market. In 2022, Switzerland signed a contract to purchase F-35 fighter jets and missile defense systems from the United States. This is a once-in-a-generation opportunity to further integrate our industrial cores. It is a great pleasure and honor for me to celebrate 200 years of our bilateral relationship against the background of such accomplishments. Who could have thought in 1822, when the first Swiss consulates opened in New York and Washington, DC, that two centuries later our two countries would have developed such strong ties?

The United States and Switzerland have always shared the core values of democracy, respect for human dignity, and the rule of law. On this foundation, our companies, citizens, and governments have succeeded in building excellent ties-economically, socially, academically-over the years. These ties have been beneficial to both countries and, today, allow Switzerland, a country of 8 million inhabitants, to contribute substantially to the welfare of the world's leading economy. With a cumulative investment of more than \$300 billion in the United States, Switzerland is the United States' 7th largest foreign direct investor and its 3rd largest investor in R&D. Further, Switzerland supports close to half a million U.S. jobs! And Swiss companies pay good salaries too: among the United States' 7 highest foreign investors, we rank 1st in terms of average salary at just under \$110,000 a year.

Investing in U.S. workers is an important focus of Switzerland's engagement in the United States. The Memorandum of Understanding on apprenticeships signed in 2021 between the two countries strengthened that aim. It allows Swiss and U.S. companies to benefit from a system of vocational training that has already proven its mettle over decades. A growing number of Swiss companies have developed vocational training programs in the United States and are actively contributing to the development of a skilled workforce, offering young men and women a debt-free start to their career, with solid work experience and a competitive salary.

Another key for the success of Swiss-U.S. relations has been the intensive scientific collaboration between Swiss and U.S. research institutes and universities. It allows the two countries to join forces in addressing challenges that our societies are facing and seize opportunities as they present themselves. From the fight against climate change, to facing a pandemic, to artificial intelligence, to quantum technology, there is no shortage of topics on which our researchers work together. This collaboration cements our companies' and countries' competitive advantages in key sectors while helping to address global issues.

I will not venture to predict what relations between Switzerland and the United States will be like 200 years from now. But I am convinced that there is great potential to further strengthen Swiss-U.S. cooperation in the coming years. It will be particularly important to watch the steps the United States has taken to fight climate change and improve its infrastructure. Switzerland's top-ranked research institutions and its highly innovative business community are excellently placed and stand ready to contribute to achieving these goals and to continue to invest in the future of the United States. I look forward to seeing what the coming years will bring. I have no doubt that our two countries will succeed in strengthening the foundations that we have already so solidly built.

# Affiliate Employment in Switzerland and the United States 2019



### Top Average Salaries at Foreign Affiliates in the United States 2019



Swiss firms strengthen the U.S. economy and represent a substantial economic presence in the United States. Large Swiss firms, together with many smaller companies, contribute substantially to the economic well-being of the United States, supporting hundreds of thousands of U.S. jobs. Switzerland is also a major destination for exports of goods and services, which generate billions of dollars in sales by U.S.-based businesses every year.

In 2019, Swiss affiliates supported 490,600 U.S. jobs nationwide at an average salary of about \$110,000. Swiss firms placed first in annual salaries paid to U.S. workers by foreign firms among large investing countries. Swiss firms accounted for nearly 200,000 U.S. manufacturing jobs, composing 7 percent of all foreign-affiliated manufacturing jobs in 2019. Food and chemicals were the largest Swiss manufacturing sectors by employment in the United States in 2019. Swiss firms also employed nearly 280,000 Americans in 2019. Swiss finance and insurance firms in the United States employed 57,000 U.S. workers, ranking third among foreign investing countries.

Switzerland is one of the largest foreign investors in the United States. As of the end of 2020, Switzerland had invested \$300 billion cumulatively in the United States and ranked as the United States' seventh-largest foreign direct investor. Swiss investment rivals that of other large foreign investors with much larger economies and populations, including France and Australia. In fact, the United States receives one-fifth of all Swiss direct investment abroad and is Switzerland's largest investment destination.

Swiss companies are active investors in the manufacturing, wholesale, retail, and services sectors of the U.S. economy, and are especially powerful contributors in pharmaceuticals and medicines and food manufacturing. To bolster their U.S. investments, in 2019, the latest year of available data from the U.S. government, **Swiss firms spent more than \$10 billion on research and development (R&D) activities in the United States, ranking third among all foreign investing countries.** Swiss affiliates supported more than 20,000 R&D-related jobs in the United States.

Switzerland ranked fifth among foreign countries in value added, generating **\$90** billion for the U.S. economy in **2019**. By the end of 2019, Swiss affiliates had invested \$109 billion in gross property, plant, and equipment.

**Swiss firms sustain American jobs in every state.** Swiss affiliates added jobs in 28 states between 2014 and 2019, with the largest percentage gains in Washington, Minnesota, and Tennessee. More than 500 Swiss companies have operations in the United States. Many have multiple affiliates in numerous states, accounting for a total of more than 4,000 affiliates.


Trade is also an integral part of the business relationship between the United States and Switzerland. Swiss firms shipped about \$12 billion in goods from their U.S. operations in 2019, amounting to 3 percent of all foreign-affiliated merchandise exports from the United States to the world. In 2021, U.S. merchandise exports to Switzerland totaled \$24 billion, making the country one of the top 20 export markets worldwide for the United States. U.S. firms ship a variety of goods to Switzerland, ranging from primary metals and chemicals to computers and transportation equipment. More than 58,000 U.S. jobs were supported by goods shipped from the United States to Switzerland.

Overall bilateral trade is more balanced when services trade is considered, as the United States enjoys a substantial services trade surplus with Switzerland. **At \$46 billion in 2021, the United States exported more services to Switzerland than manufactured goods.** Representing 6 percent of U.S. services exports worldwide in 2021, Switzerland was the fifth-largest market for U.S. services, ahead of Japan, China, and Germany. Exports of services from the United States to Switzerland supported some 217,000 U.S. jobs in 2021.

### U.S. Trade with Switzerland 2021




# I. SWISS DIRECT INVESTMENT IN THE UNITED STATES

# Swiss Cumulative Direct Investment Reaches \$300 Billion

Switzerland is the 7<sup>th</sup> largest investor in the United States. Swiss companies have a long history of investing in the large and diversified U.S. economy which offers domestic and foreign firms extraordinary business opportunities. States and localities nationwide vigorously vie for investment from Swiss firms, which brings skilled, and often highly paid, jobs to their communities.

Switzerland is the seventh-largest foreign direct investor in the United States with \$300 billion in cumulative investments by year-end 2020. Switzerland accounted for 6 percent of the \$4.6 trillion in foreign direct investment in the United States (FDIUS). By the end of 2020, Switzerland and six other countries made up nearly 70 percent of all foreign direct investment in the United States.


## Cumulative Foreign Direct Investment in the United States by Country through 2020



# Swiss Cumulative FDIUS up by 25 Percent over Five Years

Of the seven largest countries by cumulative foreign direct investment in the United States, Swiss investments rose by 25 percent between 2015 and 2020, posting the fifth-fastest rate of growth. Investments from the Netherlands grew the fastest, expanding 62 percent during the same period, closely followed by Japan. Direct investment from both Canada and Germany grew by more than 40 percent. Swiss investment growth also outpaced investments from the United Kingdom and Luxembourg, which registered divestments between 2015 and 2020. Switzerland is among the top three per capita direct investors in the United States.

# Growth of Cumulative Foreign Direct Investment in the United States by Country 2015-2020



# United States is Top Destination for Swiss Direct Investment Abroad

The United States is by far the most important destination for Swiss foreign direct investment (FDI). By the end of 2020, the United States received one-fifth of total outward Swiss investment stock. Swiss investment in the United States was also about twice that of investment in Asia or Central and South America.


### Swiss Direct Investment Abroad by Country & Region through 2020



## Finance and Holding Companies Account for Largest Share of Swiss Direct Investment Abroad

Finance and holding companies is the largest sector for Swiss direct investments abroad, making up nearly 40 percent of total Swiss investment overseas. An additional 30 percent of Swiss investment is in other services, with large investments in trade, insurance, and banks. Chemicals and plastics is the largest manufacturing sector at 12 percent.


# Swiss Direct Investment Abroad by Industry through 2020



# II. THE SWISS APPRENTICESHIP MODEL'S IMPACT ON THE U.S. ECONOMY

In Switzerland, two-thirds of all students make the choice to start their careers with an apprenticeship. At the age of 15-16, they can choose

from a large number of career paths: there are around 230 professions, across all industries, which offer apprenticeships. Apprenticeships are a central pillar of Switzerland's economic prosperity and offer great career opportunities. Two of the seven ministers on the Swiss Federal Council, the highest executive body of the Swiss Confederation, have gone through an apprenticeship program, as have countless CEOs.



Swiss companies are replicating this in the United States. In this model, the apprentices enter the workforce after high school, work, learn, and receive a good salary. It is often referred to as college without the debt. For the companies it is an investment in the future, including their own future workforce. They work together with local community colleges to establish teaching curricula, and some have inspired U.S. companies in their regions to adopt a similar apprenticeship model. The retention rate is impressive: most apprentices stay with the company after completing their program.

To solidify this exchange, in 2021, **Switzerland and the United States signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on apprenticeships** that built on the two countries' previous collaboration in vocational and professional education and training.

On August 16, 2022, President Joe Biden signed the 2022 Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) into law, with provisions incentivizing the use of the apprenticeship model in the United States. The IRA framework sets favorable conditions both for the expansion of apprenticeships in the United States and for Swiss-U.S. collaboration on this matter.

# II. THE SWISS APPRENTICESHIP MODEL'S IMPACT ON THE U.S. ECONOMY



Switzerland is a true global expert on building a talented workforce through apprenticeships. As the United States greatly expands its investments to support the creation of new apprenticeships, we must look to the examples set by Swiss multinationals, and we should partner to learn directly from the successes of true global experts on apprenticeships. All companies, whether experienced or new to apprenticeships, should ask themselves, "What will our next apprenticeship opportunity be?" and "Who can I partner with to develop it?" The Department of Commerce and our sister agencies across the Biden-Harris Administration stand by to support all companies considering their next apprenticeships.

**Companies see a real added value in investing in the future of the work-force**. "We're growing the Zurich Apprenticeship Program because apprentices have brought value to our business from the very beginning," said Zurich North America CEO Kristof Terryn, who previously served as the Zurich Group's Chief Operating Officer in Switzerland. "This is a talent source that has proven its value and versatility through many different market conditions, including at the height of the pandemic, when we expanded our program from our suburban Schaumburg headquarters to New York City." Retention in the program speaks to its efficacy: Cumulatively since 2016, 85% of apprentices have completed the two-year program, and 100% of those graduates were promoted into their next role at Zurich.



### Swiss Affiliates Support Nearly Half A Million U.S. Jobs

Swiss affiliates create hundreds of thousands of U.S. jobs. In 2019, Swiss investments supported more than 490,000 jobs across the United States, representing 6 percent of the 7.9 million jobs sustained by all foreign affiliates. Switzerland ranked behind four European countries, Japan, and Canada.

Switzerland, together with the six other largest foreign employers in the United States, accounted for nearly three-quarters of all jobs supported by U.S. affiliates of foreign companies.

### Top Countries in Employment by U.S. Affiliates of Foreign Companies 2019





# Swiss Affiliates Add More than 100,000 New Jobs over 15 Years

Between 2004 and 2019, Swiss affiliates added more than 100,000 new jobs in the United States, a 26 percent increase. During the 2007–2009 recession, at a time when the U.S. private sector shed more than two million jobs, Swiss affiliates continued adding jobs.

The latest count of jobs supported by Swiss affiliates in the United States totaled close to half a million in 2019.

#### Swiss Investment and Trade Sustain More than Three-Quarters of a Million U.S. Jobs

Swiss businesses contribute to U.S. employment in three primary ways: jobs at U.S. affiliates of Swiss companies; jobs supported by U.S. exports of services to Switzerland; and jobs tied to U.S. exports of goods to Switzerland. According to the latest data, a combined 766,000 U.S. jobs were supported by the strong bilateral trade and investment relationship between the United States and Switzerland.

Swiss affiliates accounted for 490,600 of these jobs, followed by 217,000 U.S. jobs supported by services exports to Switzerland, and 58,300 U.S. jobs supported by goods exports.


## Every State in the Nation Benefits from Swiss Trade and Investment

Swiss trade and investment support tens of thousands of jobs in states including California, New York, Texas, Florida, and New Jersey. In California alone, jobs supported by Swiss firms totaled nearly 88,000. Smaller states also gain from Swiss trade and investment, bolstering more than a thousand jobs in states such as Hawaii, Vermont, and Rhode Island.

# Swiss Affiliates Third in Research and Development Spending

Swiss firms contribute substantially to the R&D base in the United States. In 2019, Swiss affiliates accounted for nearly 15 percent of all R&D spending by foreign affiliates. Ranked third, Swiss firms spent more on R&D in the United States than affiliates from the United Kingdom, the Netherlands, Ireland, and France. The top seven countries in R&D spending made up nearly 80 percent of all R&D spending by foreign affiliates in 2019.

# Top Countries in R&D Spending by Foreign Affiliates 2019




### Swiss Affiliates Fifth in R&D Jobs

Research and development activities of Swiss affiliates yield thousands of U.S. jobs. In 2019, Swiss affiliates employed 20,300 R&D workers in the United States, behind only German, British, Japanese, and Irish firms. They also supported more R&D workers in the United States than Dutch and French affiliates.

Swiss investments in pharmaceuticals and medicines generated the greatest number of R&D jobs for Americans, employing more than 10,000 workers, the most of any country's affiliates in the United States in 2019.

## Top Countries in R&D Employment by Foreign Affiliates 2019




#### Salary at Swiss Affiliates Averages \$110,000

Among the largest countries by affiliate employment in the United States, Swiss firms paid the highest average salary, surpassing firms from Japan, Germany, Canada, and the United Kingdom.

U.S. workers at Swiss firms earned an average salary (wages + benefits) of \$109,600 in 2019, some \$38,000 more than the nation's private sector average salary of \$71,200. In 2019, Swiss affiliates accounted for a payroll of \$54 billion.


### Top Countries in Average Salaries by Foreign Affiliates in the United States 2019



# Swiss Affiliates Add More than 9,000 New Jobs in Florida Over Five Years

Swiss affiliates continue to add new jobs across the United States, in many instances by the thousands. Between 2014 and 2019, Swiss affiliates added 9,400 new jobs in Florida, the most in any state. Swiss firms' employment increased by more than 7,000 jobs in Illinois during the same time period. In Michigan, Tennessee, Washington, Minnesota, Georgia, and Ohio, more than 3,000 new jobs were added by Swiss affiliates over the past five years. Oregon and Colorado also ranked among the top 10 states by this measure.

#### Top States by Swiss Affiliate Job Creation 2014-2019



# Swiss Affiliates Rank Sixth in Manufacturing Employment

Swiss investments boost U.S. manufacturing employment. Swiss firms supported 197,300 manufacturing jobs in the United States in 2019, accounting for 7 percent of the 2.8 million U.S. manufacturing jobs supported by investments from all foreign firms. Switzerland ranks sixth among the largest manufacturing foreign employers.

## Top Countries in Manufacturing Employment by Foreign Affiliates 2019




## Food Is Top Manufacturing Sector by Swiss Affiliate Employment

Swiss affiliates play a sizable role in several manufacturing sectors, supporting tens of thousands of well-paying U.S. factory jobs. Food and chemicals represented more than half of all jobs from Swiss investment in U.S. manufacturing in 2019, topping 100,000 jobs.

Swiss investment in U.S. food manufacturing supported more than 60,000 U.S. jobs in 2019. Chemicals manufacturing, including pharmaceuticals and medicines, was the second-largest sector at 48,000 jobs. Swiss affiliates accounted for more than 20,000 jobs in electrical equipment, appliances, and components. Swiss firms also provided another 14,400 jobs in computers and electronic products and a further 14,000 jobs in machinery.


## U.S. Manufacturing Jobs Supported by Swiss Affiliates 2019



### Swiss Affiliates Rank Seventh in Services Employment

Swiss services firms provide significant employment in the United States, representing more than half of all Swiss affiliate employment, at 279,100 in 2019. Switzerland ranked seventh in affiliate employment in the services sector in 2019. The largest services sector for Swiss affiliates was administration, support, and waste management, which supported more than 100,000 jobs in 2019. The second-largest services sector was finance and insurance.

## Top Countries in Services Employment by Foreign Affiliates 2019




# Swiss Affiliates Rank Third in Finance and Insurance Employment

Swiss affiliates invest substantially in the U.S. finance and insurance sector. In 2019, Swiss finance and insurance firms in the United States employed 57,000 U.S. workers,

## Top Countries in Finance & Insurance Employment by Foreign Affiliates 2019




### Swiss Affiliates Fifth in Value Added

Swiss affiliates generated \$90 billion in value added, or their contribution to U.S. gross domestic product, in 2019, placing them fifth by this measure, ahead of France and the Netherlands. Swiss affiliates accounted for 8 percent of the \$1.1 trillion in value added produced by all foreign affiliates.

Swiss affiliates in the chemicals manufacturing industry generated the most value added of any industry at \$23 billion in 2019, which was more than the value added created by any other foreign country with investments in the U.S. chemicals sector.

Swiss affiliates in the United States also created \$21 billion in value added in the finance and insurance sector.

# Top Countries in Value Added by Foreign Affiliates 2019




## Swiss Affiliates Rank Seventh With Nearly \$110 Billion Invested in Property, Plant, and Equipment

Through 2019, Swiss affiliates invested \$109 billion in gross property, plant, and equipment in the United States. At \$106 billion, most of it was spent on plant and equipment, while only \$3 billion was invested in property and land.

At \$24 billion, the largest Swiss investment in property, plant, and equipment was in the U.S. chemicals industry, followed by \$15 billion in the U.S. finance and insurance industry.

By state, the largest investment of Swiss affiliates in U.S. property, plant, and equipment was in California, at \$18 billion in 2019. Rounding out the top five states by this measure were New York, New Jersey, Texas, and Massachusetts.

## Top Countries in Gross Property, Plant, & Equipment by Foreign Affiliates 2019




#### Swiss Affiliates Export \$12 Billion in Goods

Swiss affiliates bolster U.S. exports. In 2019, exports of U.S. goods from Swiss firms amounted to \$12 billion. U.S. affiliates from seven other countries, including Japan, the Netherlands, and the United Kingdom, each shipped more goods to foreign markets than those headquartered in Switzerland.

Fifty-four percent of all merchandise exports, or \$6.7 billion, from Swiss affiliates were exported back to their affiliate parents in Switzerland. In 2019, Swiss affiliates also imported \$15.5 billion in goods, with two-thirds purchased from affiliates' parents headquartered in Switzerland.

### Top Countries in Goods Exports by Their U.S. Affiliates 2019




#### Swiss Affiliates Pay Third-Highest U.S. Income Taxes

Like all companies in the United States, foreign affiliates pay U.S. income taxes. At nearly \$7 billion, Swiss firms ranked third, paying more taxes than Canadian and German firms in 2019. Swiss manufacturing companies paid \$4.3 billion in U.S. income taxes. Swiss companies in the finance and insurance sector also paid some \$1.6 billion in U.S. income taxes.

Taxes from Swiss affiliates, along with firms from Japan, the United Kingdom, Canada, and Germany totaled \$33 billion in 2019. Collectively, these five countries accounted for more than 60 percent of the \$54 billion in U.S. income taxes paid by all foreign affiliates in the United States in 2019.

# IV. U.S. TRADE WITH SWITZERLAND

## Switzerland Is Key Export Market for U.S.-Made Goods

Besides Swiss companies' commitment to the United States through investments, Switzerland is also a key trading partner for the United States. In 2021, U.S. merchandise exports to Switzerland totaled \$24 billion, making it the 17th largest export market for U.S. goods, behind Hong Kong and Australia, but ahead of Italy and Chile.

Primary metals is an important sector for U.S. merchandise exports to Switzerland. Other top industries by exports of U.S. goods to Switzerland include chemicals, used merchandise, computer and electronic products, and transportation equipment.


For Switzerland, the United States is a key trading partner, surpassing Germany as Switzerland's top foreign market for the first time in 70 years. Total Swiss export sales to the United States amounted to \$63 billion in 2021.

# U.S. Services Exports to Switzerland Rank as Fifth-Largest Worldwide


At \$46 billion in 2021, Switzerland is the fifth-largest market for U.S. exports of services, ahead of Japan and China. Six percent of all U.S. services exports were sold to customers in Switzerland. Fees for intellectual property usage represented the largest segment, at \$18 billion in sales, followed by professional and management consulting services at \$9 billion.

The U.S. surplus in services with Switzerland expanded to \$18 billion in 2021 from \$4 billion in 2011.


# U.S. Services Sales through Affiliates in Switzerland Rank Fourth Worldwide

U.S. exports of services to Switzerland is one way to measure the strength of the bilateral economic relationship. Because of the importance of proximity in the delivery of many types of services, U.S. multinational companies often deliver their services through their affiliates overseas rather than as exports. This is certainly the case with Switzerland.

In 2019, U.S. companies sold nearly \$100 billion in services through their affiliates in Switzerland, which is more than through their affiliates in the Netherlands, Germany, Singapore, or even Japan. In 2019, Switzerland accounted for 6 percent of the \$1.8 trillion in services supplied by U.S. overseas affiliates.

Swiss companies supplied \$65 billion in services to U.S. consumers through their affiliates in the United States.




## Top Exports of Goods by Industry from Arkansas to Switzerland, 2021




#### Top Exports of Goods by Industry from New Hampshire to Switzerland, 2021




#### Top Exports of Goods by Industry from New Mexico to Switzerland, 2021




#### Top Exports of Goods by Industry from Utah to Switzerland, 2021

Total Import Value of Goods = \$93 M








#### Employment Supported by Foreign Affiliates 2019

Total Export Value of Goods = \$13 M




#### **Top Imports of Goods by Industry from Switzerland to Vermont, 2021** Total Import Value of Goods = \$15 M








#### Top Exports of Goods by Industry from Virginia to Switzerland, 2021

Total Import Value of Goods = \$394 M








#### Top Exports of Goods by Industry from Washington to Switzerland, 2021

Total Export Value of Goods = \$116 M




#### **Top Imports of Goods by Industry from Switzerland to Washington, 2021** Total Import Value of Goods = \$221 M






#### Top Exports of Goods by Industry from West Virginia to Switzerland, 2021






## Top Exports of Goods by Industry from Wisconsin to Switzerland, 2021






#### Top Exports of Goods by Industry from Wyoming to Switzerland, 2021

#### Methodology

*Swiss Economic Impact in the United States: Creating Jobs and Supporting the U.S. Economy* is based mostly on current U.S. government data from two primary sources when Content First prepared this report in June 2022.

#### Data on U.S. Affiliates of Foreign Companies

The U.S. Department of Commerce's Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) produces comprehensive national and state data on the activities of affiliates of foreign-owned companies operating in the United States. The data, widely recognized to be the world's most comprehensive and accurate, are obtained from mandatory surveys required under the authority of the International Investment and Trade in Services Survey Act (initially enacted in 1948 and amended in 1976 and 1990). BEA released its more recent data for 2019 in August 2021.

BEA conducts mandatory surveys of foreign-owned U.S. affiliates, and it also surveys the operations of U.S. multinational firms. The results provide detailed information on a variety of financial and economic indicators, including employment, trade in goods and services, sales, and R&D expenditures.

The national and state statistics in this report cover U.S. affiliates that are majority-owned by foreign parent companies (i.e., Swiss companies). A majority-owned U.S. affiliate is a U.S. affiliate that is unambiguously under foreign control, which is more than 50 percent owned by foreign investors.

For each subsidiary, BEA requests information on both the foreign parent (i.e., the foreign business that undertakes the foreign direct investment) and the ultimate beneficial owner (UBO). An affiliate's UBO is defined to be that person, proceeding up the affiliate's ownership chain, beginning with and including the foreign parent, that is not owned more than 50 percent by another person. The UBO of each U.S. affiliate is identified to ascertain the person who ultimately controls the U.S. affiliate and who therefore ultimately derives the benefits from ownership or control. In many instances, the foreign parent and the UBO are the same entity.

#### Foreign Direct Investment

In this report, foreign direct investment in the United States is shown on an historical-cost basis through 2020, the latest available statistics at the time of publication in June 2022, or cost at time of investment. The United States defines FDIUS (inward investment) as the ownership or control, directly or indirectly, by one foreign entity of a 10 percent or more ownership share of an incorporated or unincorporated U.S. business enterprise.

#### Swiss Direct Investment Abroad

Swiss direct investment abroad was collected by the Embassy of Switzerland from the Swiss National Bank and the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development. Data are shown on a cumulative, book value (or historical-cost) basis.

#### Swiss Companies and Their Affiliates

The Embassy of Switzerland provided statistics on the names and number of Swiss companies and their affiliates in the United States using its Swiss Business Mapping database.

#### Data on Merchandise and Services Trade

The U.S. Census Bureau publishes comprehensive trade data. BEA performs that function for exports and imports of services. Statistics on goods exports and imports, nationally and by state, are the latest full-year trade statistics from the Commerce Department at the time of publication. These statistics are reported on a Census basis. USA Trade Online is the source of data on goods trade for individual countries, trade or economic groups, geographic regions, and states. Trade data were downloaded in May 2022 and may differ slightly from later revisions.

Services exports through cross-border trade and services supplied to customers overseas through foreign affiliates of U.S. companies are from BEA's October 2021 *Survey of Current Business*.

## Total Jobs Supported by Swiss Trade and Investment

Total jobs supported by Swiss trade and investment in the United States is the sum of three components:

(1) Jobs supported by Swiss affiliates in the United States as reported by BEA in its annual report on the activities of affiliates of foreign-owned companies in the United States;

(2) Jobs supported by goods exports as calculated from Jobs Supported by Export Destination, a U.S. Department of Commerce study that estimated 58,331 U.S. jobs were supported by goods exports to Switzerland. This estimate is preliminary. Each state's percentage of total merchandise exports to Switzerland are used to apportion those jobs; and

(3) Jobs supported by services exports as based on the same U.S. Department of Commerce study that shows 217,024 U.S. jobs were supported by services exports to Switzerland. State employment supported by services exports is estimated using the share of services workers in each state. State services employment data are from the Bureau of Labor Statistics' Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages.

#### Swiss Ancestry

Statistics on Swiss ancestry are from the United States Census Bureau's 2016–2020 American Community Survey (ACS) five-year estimate.
