Dear Swiss citizens in Qatar,

Let me take this opportunity to wish you and your family and friends a happy and prosperous New Year !

It is now almost one and a half years ago since I have taken over the leadership of this Embassy. The purpose of this newsletter is to review some of the highlights of the past year and to provide you with useful information.

Together with my wife Junko Kimura Doerig I had the pleasure of meeting the majority of you at the traditional Santa Claus reception at the new residence both in 2018 and just a few weeks ago or on other occasions. It is my wish to further intensify the interaction between the embassy and the Swiss community in the years ahead. One of my ideas is to gather those of you working in thematic clusters such as education, engineering, hospitality or the airline industry to foster exchange among Swiss nationals and beyond.



The Embassy of Switzerland in Doha was set up as from 2012 and inaugurated on 4 April 2013. It was given the primary tasks of contributing to the strengthening of political, economic and cultural ties between our two countries and to cater for your consular and administrative needs. My dedicated consular and visa colleagues also take care of our citizens in Kuwait and have issued more than 10'000 visa last year. Many more topics are treated by Swiss and local staff with Qatari authorities and institutions such as development principles and migrant worker issues, science and education cooperation, health issues, tourism and sports promotion, just to mention a few.

We all hope to deepen our excellent bilateral relations further and look forward to celebrating the important milestone of 50 years of diplomatic relations in 2023, just after the FIFA Football World Cup 2022, coinciding with 10 years of existence of your embassy.

I would like to focus on the important economic relations between Switzerland and Qatar, to which a big number of you contribute actively.

With a population of only around 8.7 million Switzerland is the 20th economy by nominal GDP worldwide. Qatar has added its share to our strong performance by consuming and investing massively in a variety of sectors over the years. Likewise, Switzerland has strengthened Qatar's economy and a growing number of Swiss companies have in recent years set up offices in Qatar.

Swiss exports to Qatar amounted to CHF/USD 1166 million in 2018 (871 Mio CHF as of October 2019) and Qatari exports to Switzerland to CHF 341 million (385 Mio CHF as of October 2019). Overall trade in 2018 stood therefore at 1507 million CHF, which equals our country's trade with Kuwait, Bahrain and Oman combined !

Over the next years, I believe there are still manifold opportunities to be seized for Swiss companies in Qatar. However, in Qatar's fast evolving economy, Swiss business will not have the ground all to itself while facing an increasingly demanding environment. The Embassy of Switzerland in Doha alongside with the Swiss Business Hub Middle East located in Dubai and the Swiss Business Council Qatar will continue to support our business in Qatar. Together we



have been supporting Swiss SME's in many sectors since its inception. To see this one just has to look at their increased participation in Qatari fairs such as Watch and Jewelry Doha, Agritec,

QITCOM, Qatar Hospitality, a fact that reflects the continuous strengthening of economic ties between Qatar and Switzerland.

For 2020, big projects are coming to the Embassy and the Swiss Business Hub: We are working on a political gathering this year and a top level official visit in early 2021. Likewise, business trips to Switzerland of high representatives of important Qatari institutions will be on the agenda. And of course, alongside these exciting projects, the Embassy's first preparations for the FIFA Football World Cup in 2022 alongside Qatari Government bodies and FIFA are already starting and are expected to intensify continuously ! It is my wish to update and associate many of you in these preparations, hoping strongly that the Swiss National Team (the "Nati") will qualify. Hopp Schwiiz, Allez la Suisse, Forza Svizzera, Dai Svizra !

Bilateral relations Switzerland - Qatar

Swiss delegation participates in the 140th Congress of the Interparliamentary Union (IPU)

The 140th Congress of the Interparliamentary Union (IPU) was held in Doha from 6 to 10 April 2019. Switzerland sent a seven-member delegation, which travelled to Doha alongside two colleagues from the Principality of Liechtenstein, to take part in the congress. The Swiss delegation was led by MP, Council of States, Andrea Caroni (FDP, AR). The Embassy organized an accompanying program, which included discussions with their labour attachés as well as the Qatari Deputy Minister of Labour and Social Affairs on labour reforms in Qatar.

A guided tour of the construction site of the World Cup's Final Stadium in the new town of Lusail and a meeting with the CEO of the Qatar Investment Authority (QIA) were also on the agenda. Hosting the international IPU Congress was an important success for the Government of Qatar and provided an excellent opportunity for MPs to get familiar with the host country.

Swiss-Qatari collaboration regarding migrant workers

On 1 October 2019, several important conferences and events took place on the topic of reforms of the Qatari migrant worker's scheme. Pietro Mona, Swiss Ambassador for Development, Forced Displacement and Migration, visited Doha to participate in the high-level forum "Business and migration: Strengthening dialogue between the private sector and governments" hosted by the Qatar Chamber of Commerce and Industry in cooperation with various Ministries, the International Organization of Employers (IOE) and the International Labour Organization (ILO) Project Office for the State of Qatar.



Accompanied by Mr. Edgar Doerig, Ambassador of Switzerland to the State of Qatar, and Mrs. Simone Troller, Regional Advisor Migration & Development, Ambassador Mona met with leaders at the Ministry of Administrative Development, Labour and Social Affairs, the ILO and representatives of NGOs. Various areas of concrete cooperation and exchange with Switzerland were discussed and we look forward to further support the fostering of migrant workers' rights in the country.

Various reforms were announced by the Qatari Government in recent months and relevant decisions taken just a couple of days ago. These include an important increase of the non-discriminatory minimum wage, the abolition of the required exit visas for many occupational groups, a lift of non-objections certificate as a prerequisite for changing jobs, the operationalization of the Wage Protection System as well as training of 270 labour inspectors.





Swiss National Day

Switzerland celebrated last year its 728th anniversary. To celebrate this joyous occasion, a National Day celebration was organized for more than 250 people on 3rd April 2019. This early date can be explained with the extreme summer heat in Qatar during the month of August.

The event, which was supported by Qatari and Swiss sponsors, was celebrated with traditional musical performances by Severin, Andreas and Adrian of Nidwaldner Huismusig from the central part of Switzerland as well as typical raclette cheese from Valais among many other delicacies.

Swiss athletes at the IAAF World Championships in Athletics in Doha

Qatar hosted the biennial IAAF World Championships in Athletics from 27th September to 6th October 2019. It was the first time this event came to the Middle East. During the ten-day competition 1998 athletes competed in 49 events at the Khalifa International Stadium and the Doha Corniche. Three world records were set and six championship records broken.

21 Swiss athletes participated in the mega event. Mujinga Kambundji won the only Swiss medal, an outstanding success. She won bronze over 200 m with a time of 22.51 seconds ! The Swiss women's team at the 4 x 100 m relay, consisting of Ajla Del Ponte, Sarah Atcho, Mujinga Kambundji and Salomé Kora, narrowly missed the podium and finished fourth with a great time of 42.18 seconds. This is a new national record ! Lea Sprunger also broke a Swiss record in the 400 m hurdle final. She also came fourth with a time of 54.06 seconds.

In honor of the athletes, sports officials, support staff and their families and friends a reception for over a hundred guests was organized at the residence on 4th October 2019. Representatives of the Swiss community, the Swiss Business Council Qatar as well as representatives of numerous media also took part. The Swiss Ambassador in Qatar, Mr. Edgar Doerig, and Christoph Seiler, President of Swiss Athletics, opened the event with short speeches and presented the successful athletes with Swiss army knives. Then the guests had time to mix and mingle while enjoying Swiss raclette and local delicacies.
